# **Edison PTO Monthly Meeting**

October 3, 2018

6:31pm Call to Order

## Reports -

- 1. Treasurer Judy Folckemer:
- Club Choice Fundraiser preliminary profit looks to be \$10K

- 2. Principal Mrs. Threat:
- A lunch account has been set up so that parents can donate so no child has to eat a cheese sandwich. Edison
  will keep an itemized bill for PTO records. Parents can donate to PTO for a tax deduction, or directly to Edison
  Elementary (no tax deduction).

- 5. Carnival Cassandra Zavodny:
- Carnival this Saturday. 30-40 volunteers not available due to South High's homecoming the same date. May
  have to shut some things down if we don't have enough volunteers. New this year, 5 free tickets for bringing in
  cleaning products. Kids 5<sup>th</sup> grade and up can volunteer. Sup. Thompson suggested calling Jen Schendell at North
  High.

- Holiday Shop Saturday 11/17/18, pre-Thanksgiving. 20 vendors/crafters to date. All kid-friendly and kid-priced. Each vendor will donate a gift for raffle. Each vendor will also bring their table. Vendors will need chairs supplied by Edison. Gym vs hallway works very well. Some vendors got missed last year in the hallway. Will need someone to manage the raffle table. Vendors told they can get in at 8:30am and to be ready by 10am. Beth and Angela to talk offline about promoting the event. Book Fair will be going on at the same time.

6:46pm Guest Speaker, Superintendent Steve Thompson

<u>Board Members in attendance:</u> Thomas Beal, Brian Jones, Rena Perchinske, Margaret Warner, and District Treasurer Bill Parkinson. Also, PR Catherine Beal.

Mr. Thompson briefly reviewed Issues 4 & 5 on the ballot. Details and history regarding these issues can found on the campaign flyer. Also discussed House Bill 920 which freezes the school levy at the original amount passed, so property taxes will not increase (due to levy renewal) because home values increase.

Question was asked about bond vs levy and new construction. Bond is for building and levies are for learning. Bill Parkinson discussed the audit process involved to ensure no money from bonds/levies can be cross spent.

Question was asked what if Issues 4 & 5 don't pass. Sup. Thompson stated there would be multiple attempts to get the issues to pass, however if not, it would be catastrophic to our school district. Approximately 80% of district money pays for people/salaries/benefits. Approximately 20% pays for transportation/repairs/lighting/etc. He further indicated they could not cut enough staff and stay at state minimum, to make up the difference.

Sup. Thompson asked for volunteers to deliver mailings to homes and put signs in yards to promote Issues 4 & 5.

Amy Schaum asked if there can be a representative from the Board of Elections present at the carnival for voter registration and Sup. Thompson and Catherine Beal agreed.

Sup. Thompson also discussed various target strategies to get "yes" voters to the polls.

State of the Schools Address is currently online. WE District is currently at a "C". Two areas contributing to this grade are Readiness (F) and Gap Closure (D):

- Readiness He discussed how other schools manipulate Readiness scores by limiting the students that can take
  AP classes and the AP test. WE allows any student with an interest to take AP classes and all AP students must
  take the AP exam, therefore resulting in the "F" in Readiness.
- Gap Closure 2 sub-groups African American students and special needs students. Our transient population due to the amount of apartment complexes in the district contributes to this area.

Edison is 1 of 2 schools without a bull pen. Edison will receive theirs summer of 2019. Edison does presently have the Raptor system – system of scanning drivers' licenses. Sup. Thompson also discussed the 3M window product. Not currently at all schools but that is the goal. Currently on 3 of the most high-risk schools in the district, but he would not say which three schools.

Question was asked if Browning will be converted to an elementary school. Sup. Thompson stated the current plan is to have the first floor the WE pre-school and the 2<sup>nd</sup> floor a daycare. Pre-school is currently a half day and the daycare will provide all day same location care for working parents.

Edison is currently in Phase 3 of Renovations. The extent of the repairs is unknown. Renovations will commence the summer of 2019 and be finished the summer of 2020. Staff and PTO are able to provide input as to what those renovations are.

A parent advised the Peterman Bus app has not been working properly/consistently this year. She has called them 3 times and they keep telling her they are working on it. Sup. Thompson said his office will contact them for a status update.
